The Indiana Educational Resource Center (IERC) at ISBVI, in collaboration with the Indiana Center for Accessible Materials (ICAM), provides instructional materials in specialized formats to students who are blind or have low vision in the State of Indiana.

The IERC:

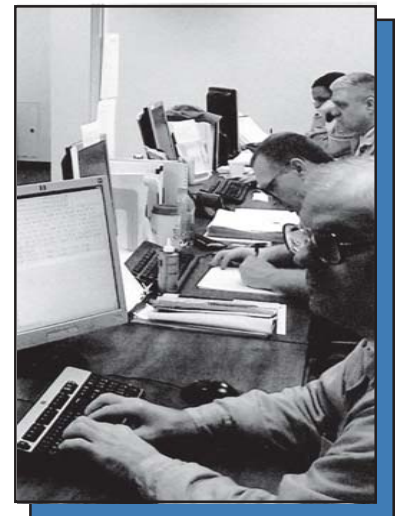
- Provides instructional resources (Braille, Digital, Enlarged Print) and specialized aids/equipment via the ICAM, to school corporations for students who are blind or have low vision.
- Oversees and manages the production of braille, accessible digital, and enlarged print instructional resources for students who are blind or have low vision through the *MAMP Project* and braille transcription through the *IERC Braille Project*.
- Conducts the APH Annual Census/Registration of students who are legally blind.
- Provides technical assistance and professional materials to staff working with students who are blind or have low vision.



The Miami Accessible Media Project (MAMP) was established in 2008 at the Miami Correctional Facility in Indiana.

MAMP produces the following for the IERC:

- Braille: Literary, Nemeth (Science and Math), Music
- Electronic Braille Files for braille notetakers
- Tactile Graphics
- Accessible Digital Files: PDF, EPUB and HTML
