Access for All Young Learners with <u>Jessica Conrad</u> (3.5 hours)

particular focus on supporting students who are non-verbal or children who benefit from visual supports for language, behavior, and literacy. We will end our time playing with free or nearly free and easy ideas to make your instruction more accessible to every learner.

Access to the Curriculum via Access to Communication for Students with Significant Disabilities with <u>Julie Kuhn</u> (1-3 hours)

It helps staff and students move beyond cause and effect and recognize the efforts towards pre-literacy and literacy with a developmental focus. No matter the grade, this is age appropriate.
