Some very easy changes in digital documents and videos can make them more accessible. You will experience several options to do this. From learning what makes a digital document and how to keep it that way. To learning the proper way to alt text pictures and create or just turn on closed captioning for videos.

Access for All Young Learners with Jessica Conrad (3.5 hours)

Target Audience: All General and Special Education Teachers, Therapists, Paraprofessionals, and/or Administrators serving students ages 3-10

Description: Designed specifically for teachers, therapists, assistants, and administrators working with young students ages 3-10, this hands-on seminar will explore the newest and best technology and tools to support all learners in early literacy, communication, mathematics, social skills and more. This seminar will have a particular focus on supporting students who are non-verbal or children who benefit from visual supports for language, behavior, and literacy. Aim Changers, Game Changers, and Designing a Classroom for ALL Students with Rachel Herron

Collaboration with other teachers, Universally Designed Classrooms and broadening the scope of HOW to include students sometimes take a backseat to WHY we are doing it. Come to this session to shift the view, learn some tips and tricks and increase understanding of why it is important to consider every child while planning each day.

Apps and Extensions to Increase Reading & Writing Accessibility with Sandi Smith (45 minutes - 3 hours)

Chrome apps and extensions can be used to make reading and writing accessible for our students. The text can be read aloud, chosen and parceled out in ways that allow our students to increase their comprehension and work on their overall reading and writing mechanics while digesting content. This session supports all middle school and high school students.

Autism Spectrum: High Expectations for ALL Students with Kelli Suding (1 hour)

Description: This is a beginner session that tackles the complex needs of students on the autism spectrum with discussions and strategies to support behavior and classroom engagement through teaching executive functioning skills and implementation of the Universal Design for Learning principles. This is a focus on presuming competence and maintaining high expectations for ALL students. Attendees will leave with an understanding of the "why" some behaviors seem perplexing and multiple methods to utilize in supporting students on the spectrum to become independent learners, while demonstrating tools that can be used in the school setting.

Built-in Accessibility for Students with Blindness and Low Vision: Choose your Platform with Bev Sharritt (1-3 hours)

Design with the Right tools - Mystery Tech Challenge with All Specialists (Time Varies)

In this interactive session, participants will explore various assistive technology tools and learn about best practice use and assessment. This session will address assistive technology within universally designed educational environments with practical suggestions across the community, school, and home.

Desmos Accessibility for Students with Blindness and Low Vision with Bev Sharritt (1.5 hours)

Target Audience: Blind/Low Vision (BLV) Educators and/or Administrators

Description: The Desmos suite of math tools was designed from the ground up to be accessible for students with blindness and low vision. The Desmos calculators will be the online tools available for the new ILEARN Test beginning 2019. This training will help you prepare your students to access the calculators and customize accessibility to enhance their daily math instruction.

DHH in the UDL World (Deaf/Hard of Hearing in the Universal Design for the Learning World) with Katie Taylor (1 hour)

Keywords: Universal Design for Learning, UDL, Deaf/Hard of Hearing, DHH

Target Audience: Special Education Teachers, General Education Teachers, Teachers of the Deaf/Hard of Hearing

Description: Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is a way to make sure ALL of our students have access to grade level curriculum. In this webinar, we will take a look at Universal Design for Learning and considerations for our students who are deaf/hard of hearing in your classroom.

Digital Portfolios for High School Transition and Much More! with Sandi Smith (45 minutes - 1 hour)

Target Audience: All General and Special Education Teachers, Administrators, and/or Paraprofessionals

Description: Design a dynamic site with your students that will express their uniqueness as well as curate the scope of their pre - 12 education. Highlight their: training, IEP, testing documentation, assistive technology experience, accommodation and modification history, and, personal living skills for post-secondary organizations. Along the way, we will explore the digital options and ins and outs of privacy as we create an accessible, living document for their transition from school and beyond.

Executive Planning for Executive Functioning with Rachel Herron (1-3 hours)

Target Audience: Any staff member supporting a student with Executive Functioning deficits in a Kindergarten-12 classroom.

Description: Deficits in Executive Functioning shape the daily life for students across our state. This session focuses on exploring a variety of apps, techniques, and strategies that help with organization, planning, time management, and working memory.

Expanding on Executive Planning for Executive Functioning (Part 2) with Rachel Herron (1-3 hours)

Keywords: AT, Assistive Technology, ED, Emotional Disabilities, Elementary, Secondary

Target Audience: Any staff member supporting a student with Executive Functioning deficits in a Kindergarten-12 classroom.

Description: This second part of the original session, Executive Planning for Executive Functioning, expands on the original webinar and focuses apps, techniques, and

strategies that help with metacognition, response inhibition, emotional control, and task initiation.

Eye See AAC with Jessica Conrad and Bev Sharritt (3 hours)

Description: Jessica Conrad, Specialist for Early Intervention and Augmentative and Alternative Communication, and Bev Sharritt, Specialist for Blind Low Vision AT and AEM will present together strategies for communication and language development for students with blindness and low vision. This afternoon session will explore different accommodations for specific functional eye conditions, and share ideas for collaboration between the SLP, classroom teacher, and the BLV teacher.

Getting Started with your AAC Device with Jessica Conrad (45 minutes - 3 hours)

I Love Data with Jessica Conrad (1 hour)

Target Audience: All General and Special Education Teachers, Therapists, and/or Administrators

Description: Turn information mountain into automated magic! We'll show off some Google tools used by therapists, teachers and AT coordinators to make progress monitoring, timeline watching, case history filling, device training, student information gathering, and team communication a snap. For anyone who is a little nervous around spreadsheets, this will be a practical and hands-on optional demonstration of Google Sheets, AutoCrat and Form Mule.

I Repeat, "It's NOT Cheating" with Kelli Suding (1 hour)

Keywords: Dyslexia, Universal Design for Learning, Assistive Technology, Accommodations, Equity, Accessible Educational Materials

Target Audience: All educators, administrators, paraprofessionals

Description: “That’s cheating,” “They need to do that by themselves” are often comments aligned with the use of appropriate accommodations of accessible educational materials (AEM) and assistive technology (AT) for students with disabilities. But how can we promote a culture of Universal Design for Learning (UDL) and at the same time step outside of our “No, it’s not cheating” echo chamber to have meaningful conversations with educators who may see accommodations as a crutch? This session will explore ways to debunk the mindset of “it’s cheating’ through personal stories, short simulations, discussion of the different skill sets of reading and the “what” is accessible educational materials (AEM) and most importantly the “why.”

I Speak/I Learn with AAC with Jessica Conrad (3 hours)

Keywords: AAC, Augmentative & Alternative Communication, Literacy, Preschool-12+

Target Audience: Anyone on a team supporting a student with AAC, Preschool-12

Description: Participants will learn the basics of supporting AAC users (and others who benefit from visual representation for language and literacy) with core vocabulary. Skills include Aided Language Input (ALI), appropriate cueing hierarchy, and core language supports and ideas. Then we will be putting what we learn into action. This facilitative hour is focused on identifying opportunities and barriers in your classroom, problem-solving and organizing resources, the descriptive teaching model, and appropriate goal and data collection for AAC users.
