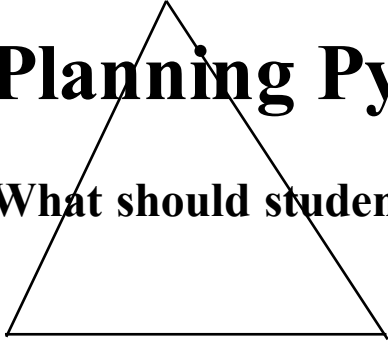

Most students will know

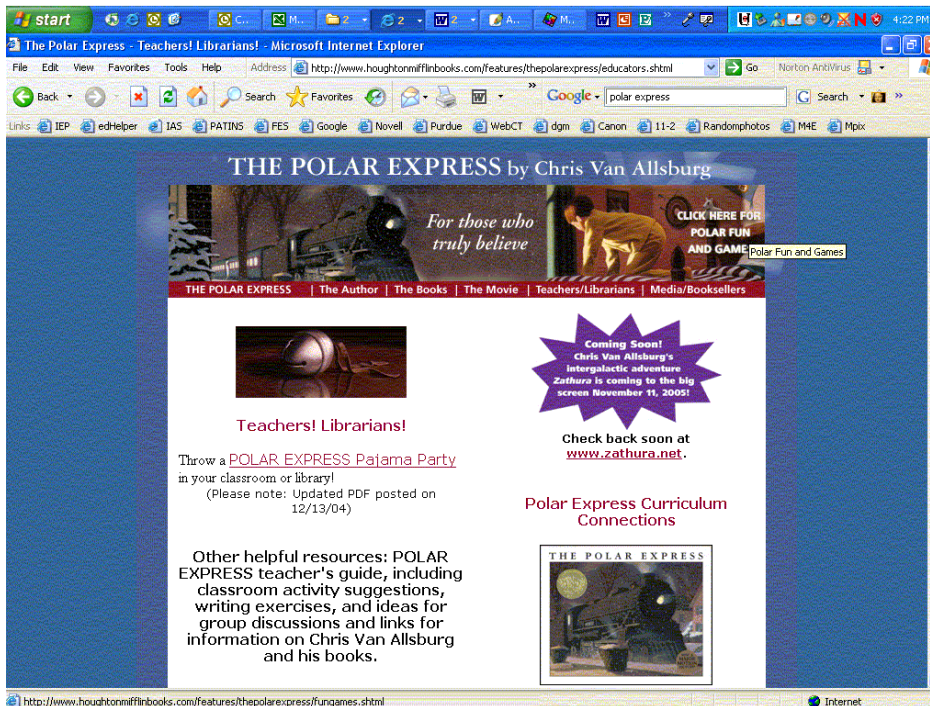
How to proofread their writing, form letters correctly, space words and sentences properly so that writing can be easily read.
